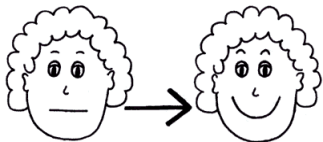
December 4

*(O Emmanuel)*

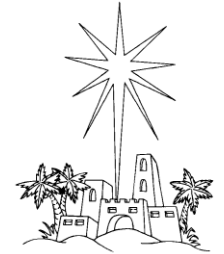


O Come, O come, Emmanuel,
